The Guiding Star camp takes place once a year at the luxurious Metropolis Resort in Eau Claire, Wisconsin. All lodging, meals and family activities are provided at NO COST to the families attending.

Who is eligible?

Families who have lost a child (ages 0-17 years of age) to a life threatening illness within the last five years. A professional referral is required (healthcare professional, support group moderator, spiritual advisor, etc.).

Who should attend?

This unique camp includes the whole family, parents and siblings.

What should be expected?

The Guiding Star Camp is built around helping parents and siblings connect with each other and other families who have had a similar experience. These connections help to normalize and validate their experience, while offering the support needed for healthy healing. Some of the activities include:
