





# Project Overview



Approximately 300 private homes on the reservation

115 # of test kits used to date (84 returned)

Radon results (% <a>4pCi/L) 64%</a>

25 mitigations completed with outside funding (approx. \$30,000)13 mitigations completed with tribal funding assistance
