USPSTF Announces Updated Breast Screening Guidelines

The U.S. Preventive Services Task Force released new guidelines advising women to get a mammogram every other year starting at age 40 and until age 74.

The USPSTF is a volunteer panel of independent medical experts. Their recommendations can help guide doctors' decisions and influence insurance plans. Their previous recommendation had been for biennial mammograms starting by age 50 and the decision to screen in their 40s "should be an individual one" for women.

See the Job Posting Wisconsin U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin was recently honored with the Congressional Champion for Cancer Care award by the American Society for Clinical Oncology (ASCO). Baldwin was recognized for her ongoing commitment to funding cancer research.

The presentation took place during the annual ASCO Advocacy Summit in Washington. Oncology care providers from across the country met with members of Congress and their staff to advocate for cancer priorities.

The award acknowledges members of Congress who champion policies to improve research and care delivery for people with cancer. This year, ASCO recognized Senator Baldwin and Senator Shelley Moore Capito (R-WV) for their work leading the Senate Appropriations Committee's Subcommittee on Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education in a strong bipartisan manner, and their ongoing commitment to funding cancer research at the National Institutes of Health and National Cancer Institute.

Limiting Alcohol May Reduce Cancer Deaths

A recent CDC study found that more than 20,000 alcohol-related cancer deaths occurred per year during 2020 and 2021. Alcohol use increases the risk of several types of cancer, including liver, female breast, colorectal, mouth and throat (oropharyngeal), and others. It's estimated that about 80% of these deaths could have been prevented if all adults

who drank above the Dietary Guidelines for Americans had instead consumed alcohol within the recommended daily limits. The daily limits are two drinks or less for men and one drink or less for women.
