WHAT IS HPV?

Human papillomavirus (HPV) is a common virus that can cause some types of cancers.

Only 5 out of 10 teenagers are fully vaccinated by age 18.



The HPV vaccine is safe, effective, and helps prevent genital warts and these cancers:

- 1 Head & Neck
- 2 Cervical
- 3 Anal
- 4 Vaginal & Vulvar
- 5 Penile
