Radon Education & Test Kit Distribution





Project Background

Jackson County is consistently higher than the state average for the number of homes testing >4 pCi/L, with 53.3% of tests above this level in 2022. During our 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment, over 70% of Jackson County residents reported having never tested their home for radon. Lung cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in Jackson County and is the leading cause of cancer death in Jackson County.

Project Overview and Goals

The goal of our project was to educate residents on the importance of radon testing, increase awareness of the connection between radon and cancer risk, and distribute free test kits to residents in Jackson County. It was also our goal to serve as a resource for information if the testing came back above the recommended level.

Aims of this project included increasing access to the test kits throughout Jackson County by collaborating with each of the local village halls to serve as a distribution site.

Project Activities

Through this generous grant opportunity, we purchased 200 radon home test kits to distribute for free to residents. We also purchased retractable banners and other educational materials to place in the lobby of each village hall to draw attention to the test kits and provide education on the importance of knowing your home's radon level.
