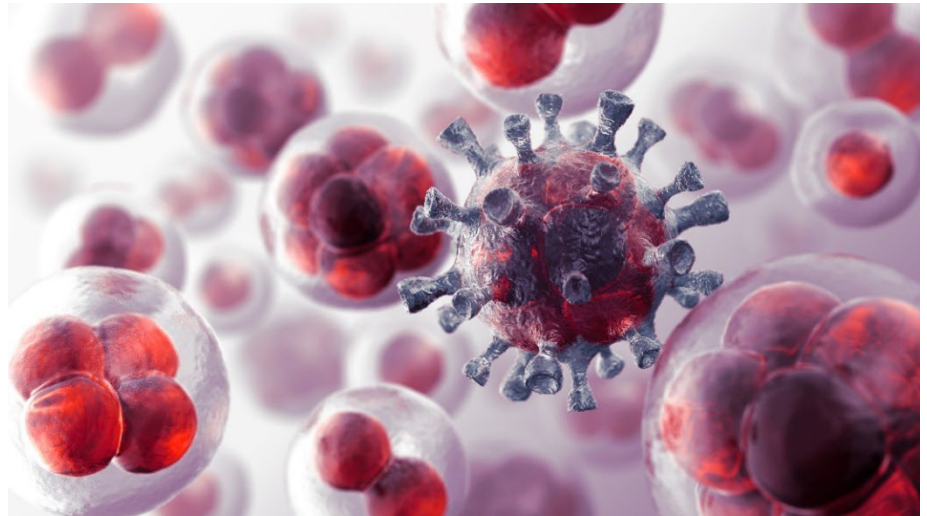
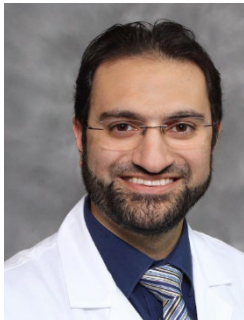


# Equal Access, Better Outcomes: A Community Conversation on Multiple Myeloma and Health Equity
