# Tobacco, Vaping, and Alcohol Prevention Resources

### Vaping Prevention Curriculum for Various Grade Levels

- <u>WI Tobacco and Vaping Prevention Lessons (DPI)</u> Free four-lesson curricula geared towards students in grades 3-5, 6-8, and 9-12 available for download.
- <u>Vaping: Know the Truth (Truth Initiative)</u> Free digital lessons geared towards students in grades 8-12. This curriculum contains two newly-added lessons on cannabis use! <u>Learn more</u> about the program.
- <u>Catch My Breath (UTHealth School of Medicine and Public Health)</u> Free, evidenced-based program for students in grades 5-12 with additional parent-tailored content. <u>Learn more</u> about the program.
- <u>Tobacco Education Resource Library Lesson Plans (HHS)</u> Four different lesson plans for grades 6-12 covering important vaping topics, along with additional classroom materials.
- You and Me, Together Vape Free Curriculum (Stanford REACH Lab) Five-lesson curriculum for elementary, middle, and high school students. This curriculum includes educator crash courses about the topics, a parent letter, and pre- and post-surveys for evaluating student learning.
