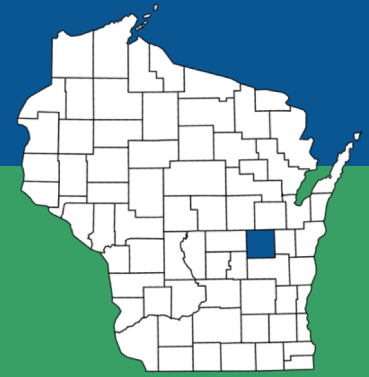
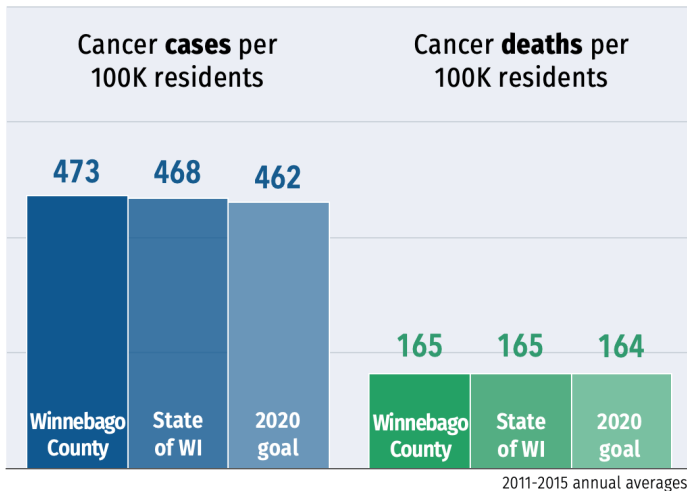

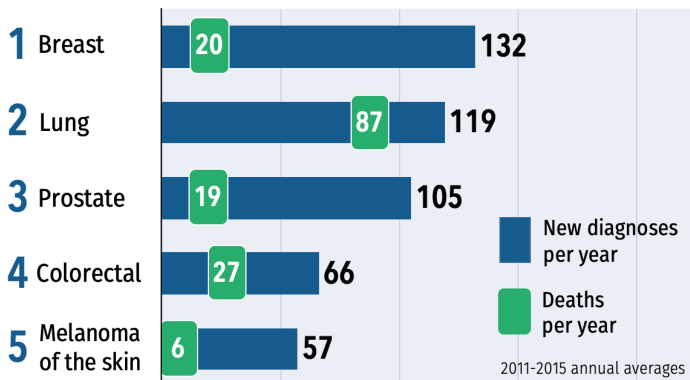

How Winnebago ranks among WI counties

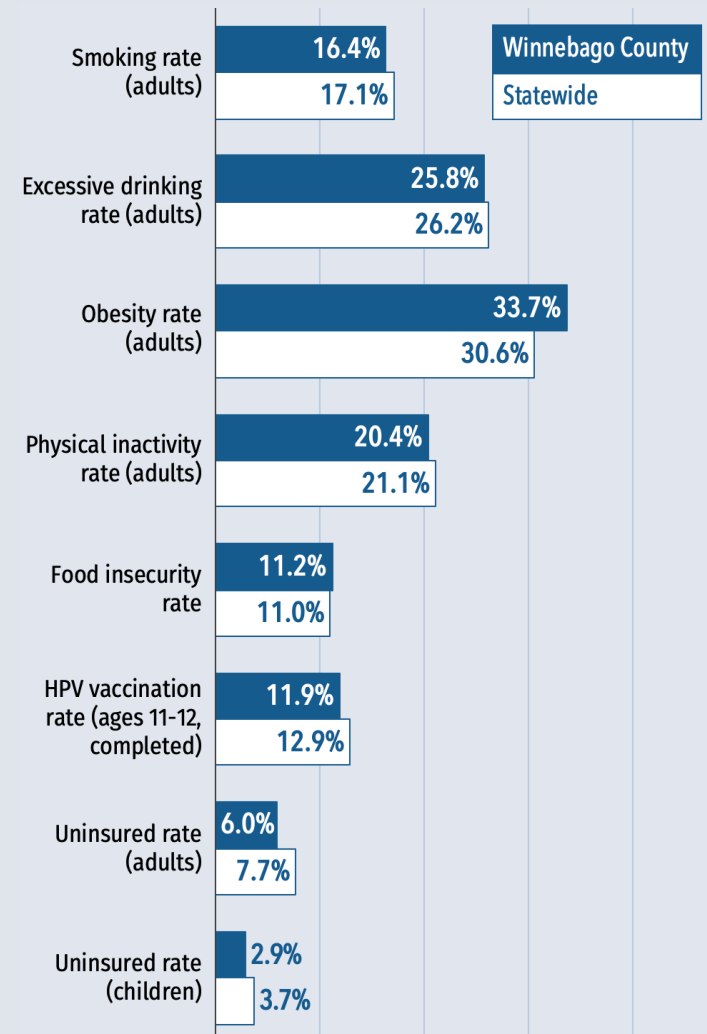
